1. Nancy Laplante (13 June 1982 - ...): Born in Montreal, Canada. Green eyes, black hair, 183 cm, athletic, expert in pistol shooting and black belt 6th Dan in Karate.. I.Q. of 153, Master's Degree in International Relations and Minor in Military History. In 2012, spoke French, English, Spanish, German, Russia, Arabic and Pashto. War correspondent for CONFLICTS Magazine and reserve officer in the Canadian Forces (Captain in the Military Intelligence Branch). Kidnapped in 2012 by two renegade scientists from the World Council of the 34th Century and abandoned near London, England in the year 1940. Fought on the British side during the 2nd World War and involuntarily caused the creation of a new, parallel timeline, Timeline 'B'. Saved from the past in 1941 after being given supernatural powers as a Chosen of 'The One' and brought to the year 3384 'A' by Farah Tolkonen . Forms the Time Patrol with Farah Tolkonen and becomes its chief of operations.

- 4. <u>James Sommers</u> (1682 1704): Born in Boston, in the colony of New England. Captured at the age of four by the Iroquois after they massacred his family. Adopted by an Iroquois warrior who also took an Algonquin slave as a wife. James was then raised as an Iroquois hunter and warrior. Killed in a battle against French settlers. Spoke English, Iroquois, Algonquin and some French.
- 5. <u>Karl Beck</u> (1581 1632): Born in Koln, Germany. Mercenary chieftain, served with Protestant forces during the Thirty Years War. Died from the Black Plague near Hamburg. Spoke German, Italian, French and Latin.
- **6.** <u>Kiti Batrang</u> (1488 1525): Born in a small village in Siam (Thailand). Married to a young farmer, had four children. Died from a tropical fever. Spoke Thai.
- 7. Jeanne, dite La Pucelle (Joan of Arc) (1413 1431):
 Born in Domrémy, France. Pushed by visions into fighting the English invaders and support the French heir to the throne. Inflicted a number of stinging defeats to the English before being captured and then judged as a heretic by a religious tribunal. Burned at the stake in Orleans. Eventually rehabilitated by the Church and became the greatest heroine in French history. Spoke Old French and Lorrain.



- 8. Isha (1389 -1390): Yemenite baby girl born near Aden. Died of malnutrition.
- Tanya Laskova (1314 1346): Born in Novgorod, Kingdom of Kiev. Married to a fur merchant, had five children. Froze to death during a long Winter trip. Spoke Ukrainian, Russian and Polish.
- **10.** <u>Sulawayo</u> (1222 1256): Born in the Natal (South Africa). Swahili warrior and hunter. Killed during a battle against an enemy tribe. Spoke Swahili.
- 11. <u>Sire John of Nottingham</u> (1140 1171): Born in Nottingham, England. Made a knight by his father. Went on a pilgrimage to Palestine. Killed while fighting Muslim soldiers near Jerusalem. Spoke Old English, Normand and Latin.
- **12.** <u>Maliwatang</u> (1031 1099): Born in the island of Bali, near Java. Raised and trained as a musician and dancer at the court of the Prince of Bali. Trained other girls as

- dancers and musicians. Died of old age at the Bali Court. Spoke the Bali dialect, Javanese and Malay.
- **13.** <u>Skadi</u> (958 982): Born in Upsala, Sweden. Wife of one of the King's guards. Died in labor during her second pregnancy. Spoke Norse.
- **14.** <u>Kimi Oshiwa</u> (866 900): Born near Kyoto, Japan. Raised as a Shirabyoshi, or courtesan. Became a high level courtesan known for her beauty and her talents as a singer, dancer and poet at the Emperor's Court. Killed by a jealous customer. Spoke Japanese and Chinese.
- **15.** <u>Bashir Suleiman</u> (749 811): Born in Toledo, Omayyad Emirate (Spain). Learned the art of sword making from his father. Married, with five children. Died of a heart attack. Spoke Moorish and Arabic.
- **16.** <u>Uatlac</u> (642 683): Born in Teotihuacan, Mexico. Mayan artisan specializing in obsidian sculpting. Married, had two children. Died of an infection. Spoke Mayan.
- 17. <u>Yasmina</u> (586 603): Born near Hamadan, Persia. Sold as a slave at the age of nine to the harem of the King of Bagdad and trained as a dancer. Tortured and beheaded after trying to flee from the harem. Spoke Persian.
- **18.** <u>Zawila</u> (504 520): Born in the Sudan. Member of a nomadic tribe. Died during her first childbirth. Spoke a Sudanese dialect.
- **19.** Rutgen (436 455): Born in a farm near the location of Hamburg, Saxony. Joined an expedition heading for England but drowned during the trip. Spoke Saxon.
- 20. Wei Lin (329 381): Born in Tschang An, Wei Empire (Northern China). Married to a mid-level imperial mandarin, had four children. Died of a disease. Spoke Mandarin.
- 21. <u>Loegaire</u> (254 277): Born near Tara, in the Connaught (Ireland). Stable boy for the King of Tara, then became a warrior in his army. Killed during a dispute with a rival of his king. Spoke Gaelic.
- **22.** <u>Marcus Gallus</u> (159 201): Born in Luna, Italy. Roman Centurion. Served in North Africa near Timgad (Tunisia), then was transferred on the 'Limes', near Regensburg, Germany. Killed by Goth barbarians during the reign of Emperor Septimus Severus. Spoke Latin and Koine.
- 23. <u>Choktuk</u> (86 102): Born on the shores of Hudson Bay, Canada. Young Inuit hunter and fisherman. Killed by a polar bear which wanted to take his catch. Spoke Inuktuk.
- **24.** <u>Magdala</u> (11 BCE 30 CE): Born in Jericho, Judea. Married a shoemaker, had four children. Died of a fever. Spoke Aramaic and Hebrew.

- 25. <u>Mirkos</u> (112 74 BCE): Born near the site of Nis, in Dacia (Serbia). Cattle rancher. Killed with his family by robbers. Spoke Dacian.
- 26. <u>Ideshi Tomonaga</u> (215 170 BCE): Born in Nara, Japan. Warrior at the service of a local chieftain. Killed while protecting his master against a group of assassin. Spoke Old Japanese.
- 27. Xagu (291 276 BCE): Born in the Basque Country. Sheep herder. Killed by a pack of wolves in Winter. Spoke the Basque language.
- 28. Noor (386 358 BCE): Born in Madras, India. Trained as a courtesan and dancer. Extremely beautiful and sensual. Fled to Pataliputra to escape the wrath of the Rajah of Madras. After falling in love with a young noble at his court. Found and killed by an assassin sent by the Rajah. Spoke Sanskrit, Tamil, Hindi and Bengali.
- 29. <u>Tsong Yi</u> (510 452 BCE): Born in a fishing village on the southern coast of China. Fisherman, married, with three children. Drowned during a fishing expedition.
- 30. <u>Chupac</u> (599 572 BCE): Born in the city of La Venta (East Coast, Central America). Olmec warrior. Killed during a battle with invaders from another city-state. Spoke Olmec.
- **31.** Nauca (701 662 BCE): Born on the coast of Thracia, on the Black Sea. Married at 15, had five children. Sacrificed herself on the grave of her husband. Spoke Thracian.
- 32. <u>Marina</u> (809 764 BCE): Born in Athens, Greece. Wife of a modest merchant, had three children. Died of a disease. Spoke Attic Greek.
- **33.** <u>Memhotep</u> (924 873 BCE): Born in Memphis, Egypt. Scribe working for the royal house of Memphis. Married, with five children. Died of cancer. Spoke Egyptian, Phoenician, Minoan and Nubian.
- **34.** Mbanga (1006 992 BCE): Born in Kenya. Young Masai cattle herder. Killed by a lion. Spoke an old Masai dialect.
- **35.** <u>Eda</u> (1119 1075 BCE): Born near Unetice, on the River Elbe in Central Europe. Proto-Celt farm girl. Married, had one child. Captured by Goth marauders and forced into slavery. Died of maltreatment. Spoke Old Celt and Ostrogoth.
- **36.** <u>Kahamana</u> (1248 1188 BCE): Born in East Timor. Melanesian woman married to a fisherman, had six children. Drowned with her entire family during a sea trip. Spoke Melanesian.

- 37. <u>Pratos</u> (1357 1316 BCE): Born in Itanos, Crete. Mycenaean winemaker. Married, with five children. Died of a disease. Spoke Ancient Greek and Minoan.
- 38. <u>Agadai</u> (1457 1420 BCE): Born in the Gobi Desert. Mongol nomad herder. Died in a sand storm. Spoke Mongol.
- **39.** <u>Amnirat</u> (1542 1528 BCE): Born in Sidon, Phoenicia. Married at the age of thirteen. Died during her first childbirth. Spoke Phoenician.
- **40.** <u>Mian Tschu</u> (1639 1603 BCE): Born near the Yang Tse River in Central China. Impoverished peasant. Married, with four children. Spoke during a general famine. Spoke a local Chinese dialect.
- 41. Saraï of Ur (1791 1714 BCE): Born in the Sumerian city of Ur, Chaldea (Iraq). Married the patriarch Avram (Abraham) and followed him during a long trip to the Northwest up the Euphrates River, to Anatolia and then down south along the Mediterranean coast towards Egypt. Then returned to Canaan (Palestine). Had many children from Abraham, including Isaac. Died of old age. Buried in Hebron with Abraham. Spoke Chaldean and Cananean.



- **42.** Ononkapis (1899 1867 BCE): Born in the Canadian western prairies. Amerindian hunter. Married, with three children. Froze to death during a Winter hunting expedition. Spoke Old Cree.
- **43.** <u>Amtsuta</u> (1992 1970 BCE): Born in the delta of the Indus River. Married an artisan and went to live with him in Mohenjo-Daro. Had two children. Died during her third child labor. Spoke Indo-European.
- **44.** <u>Kurgan</u> **(2097 2066 BCE)**: Born near the Caspian Sea. Sarmatian nomad. Had two wives and twelve children. Killed during a marauding expedition. Spoke Sarmat, Scythian and Thracian.
- **45.** Nebkaouri (2223 2170 BCE): Born in Thebes, Egypt. Was a royal princess of Thebes. Had six children. Poisoned by a rival. Spoke Old Egyptian, Nubian and Phoenician.
- **46.** <u>Niame</u> (2312 2289 BCE): Born near the southern tip of Africa. Nomad huntergatherer. Killed by a group of hyenas. Spoke Old Bantu.
- **47.** Maliki (2394 2381 BCE): Born in Java (Indonesia). Daughter of a fisherman. Died of an infection. Spoke Old Javanese.

- **48.** Chuila (2500 2463 BCE): Born in Chuquitanta, on the central coast of Peru. Married a stone mason, had six children. Died of a disease. Spoke Quechua.
- **49.** Addira (2611 2570 BCE): Born in the Phoenician city of Gebal (Byblos). Priest of Baalat-Gebal. Married, with four children. Killed when Amorite raiders took and burned down Gebal. Spoke Phoenician, Cananean and Minoan.
- **50.** <u>Kang-Ji</u> (2705 2675 BCE): Born on the coast of Eastern Siberia. Hunter-gatherer. Married, with two children. Killed by a bear. Spoke an old Siberian dialect.
- **51.** Mersina (2797 2776 BCE): Born in the ancient city of Troy, in Asia Minor. Wool weaver. Married, had one child. Killed by her husband for having committed adultery. Spoke Trojan.
- **52.** <u>Lougar</u> **(2916 2880 BCE)**: Born in the Sumerian city of Kish. Pottery maker. Married, had six children. Died of a disease. Spoke Sumerian.
- **53.** Nabila (3003 2986 BCE): Born in the Nubian Desert. Taken into slavery by Egyptians at the age of twelve and brought to Memphis. Employed as a dancer. Executed on orders from the Queen of Memphis after having an adventure with a young guard. Spoke Nubian and Old Egyptian.
- **54.** <u>Cautivar</u> (3109 3077 BCE): Born in the Sussex (England). Celtic farmer and sheep rancher. Killed by wolves in Winter while collecting fire wood. Spoke Gaelic.
- **55.** <u>Lia Xian</u> (3217 3182 BCE): Born in Central China. Silk weaver. Mother of four children. Died of pneumonia. Spoke an old Chinese local dialect.
- **56.** <u>Tlaloc</u> (3316 3289 BCE): Born on the Venezuelan coast of the Caribbean Sea. Fisherman, married, with two children. Drowned in a flood. Spoke a local proto-Amerindian dialect.
- **57. Bo (3422 3389 BCE)**: Born in the South of Australia. Nomad hunter-gatherer. Married, with three children. Died in a fall. Spoke an Austral dialect.
- **58.** <u>Frida</u> (3529 3495 BCE): Born near Skrydstrup, Denmark. Married to a tribal chief, had four children. Killed by marauders while helping to defend her village. Spoke Old Norse.
- **59.** <u>Tabitha</u> (3634 3607 BCE): Born in the Galilean Desert. Daughter of nomad herders. Married, had three children. Died during her fourth childbirth near Meggido. Spoke Cananean.
- **60.** <u>Daru</u> **(3750 3711 BCE)**: Born east of the Caspian Sea. Indo-European nomad. Married, with four children. Died of an infected wound. Spoke Indo-European.

- **61.** <u>Arba</u> **(3848 3830 BCE)**: Born near the present location of Toulouse, in the South of France. Hunter and stone toolmaker. Killed by a cave bear. Spoke Proto-Basque.
- **62.** <u>Koatlat</u> (3955 3928 BCE): Born near present-day Winnipeg, Canada. Nomad hunter-gatherer. Married, had two children. Killed by a bison that he had wounded during a hunting trip. Spoke Proto-Cree.
- **63.** <u>Simdari</u> (4101 4073 BCE): Born in the mountains of Kurdistan. Wife of a Neolithic hunter-gatherer living in a cave in the Turkish-Iraqi frontier region. Died of pneumonia. Spoke Proto-Kurd.
- **64.** <u>Zouamo</u> (4203 4179 BCE): Born in the jungles of Central Congo. Married to a hunter in her tribe, had three children. Killed by a crocodile. Spoke a Mesolithic African dialect.
- **65.** <u>Sumush</u> (4307 4278 BCE): Born in El-Obeid, Sumerian Basin. Sumerian brick maker and mason. Married, had three children. Died of an infected wound. Spoke Proto-Semite.
