

## PAST LIVES OF INGRID WEISS

1. **Ingrid Weiss (7 Sep 1925 - ...)**: Born in Berlin, Germany. German Jew and ex-Luftwaffe female auxiliary who enrolled while underage after her whole family was killed in a British air bombing of Berlin. Taken prisoner by the British in 1940, earned Nancy Laplante's affection while held at the Tower of London with other German female auxiliaries and was secretly adopted by Nancy and by Mike Crawford. 175 cm, brownish-red hair, blue eyes. Very beautiful, highly intelligent, brave and strong-minded. Born-pilot with exceptional visual acuity. Her timeline twin, Ingrid Dows, is a fighter pilot in the USAF of Timeline 'C'. Ingrid Weiss 'B' is the pilot of a time patrol ship and field agent of the Time Patrol in Timelines 'A' and 'B'. Ingrid Weiss 'A' died in 1945 during an Allied bombing raid on Berlin. Spoke German, Yiddish, French and English before remembering her past incarnations at the same time as Nancy Laplante, thanks to 'The One'.



2. **Thomas Green (14 Nov 1838 – 25 Mar 1876)** : Born on a plantation near Birmingham, Alabama, USA. American black slave. Married, father of three children. Died of an infection after being savagely flogged by the foreman of the plantation. Spoke English.
3. **Tran Qui Khiem (1721 -1786)** : Vietnamese peasant born in the village of Gia Rai, in the Mekong Delta. Married, with five children. Died of a tropical fever. Spoke Vietnamese.
4. **Nitsoatong (1618 – 1645)** : Algonquin hunter and warrior born on the island of Montreal, Canada. Married, with three children. Killed in a fight with Iroquois warriors. Spoke Algonquin, Iroquois and a bit of French.
5. **Nadia Romanova (1476 – 1560)** : Daughter of a Kiev Boyar, in Ukraine. Married to a rich boyar, had six children. Died of old age. Spoke Ukrainian, Russian, Polish and Romanian.
6. **Malitanang (1379 – 1402)** : Born in a small fishing village on the island of Mindanao, Philippines. Married to a fisherman, had two children. Died of a fever. Spoke Cebuano and Tagalog.
7. **Djanggalawula (1262 – 1314)** : Australian aborigine who lived near Darwin. Hunter-gatherer, married, with four children. Died from an infected wound. Spoke Wagiman, a Ginwinyguan dialect.
8. **Guy d'Aurillac (1160 -1203)** : Knight of the Templar Order. Born in the Castle of Aurillac, in the South of France. Celibate. Killed during the Crusaders' assault on Constantinople during the Fourth Crusade. Spoke Occitan and Latin.
9. **Judith (1026 – 1101)** : Born in Fez, Morocco, from Jewish parents. Married to a Jewish merchant, mother of seven children. Died of old age. Spoke Hebrew, Castilian and Arabic.
10. **Tandjipura (931 – 966)** : Born in the Ganges Delat, India. Elephant driver for the Rajah of Tamralipti (Kingdom of Pala). Married, father of two children. Killed in a battle between soldiers of the Rajah and a group of bandits. Spoke Hindi.
11. **Tsuko (823 – 868)** : Born in Kyoto, Japan. High-ranking geisha at the Emperor's court. Served as a lady-in-waiting for one of the Emperor's daughters. Died of pneumonia during a Winter trip. Spoke Japanese.
12. **Marcel (739 – 764)** : Born in Brittany, Kingdom of Francia. Heavy cavalryman in the Frankish army of King Pépin the Short. Killed in a fight with Moors near Narbonne. Spoke Breton, Occitan and the Oïl dialect.

13. **Aïsha (614 – 678)** : Born in Mecca, Arabia. Daughter of Abu Bakr. Third wife and favorite of the prophet Mohamed. Intelligent young woman with a strong character. Died as a recluse widow. Spoke Arabic and Persian.
14. **Gondar (490 – 551)** : Born in Nidaros (Trondheim), Norway. Carpenter and boat builder. Married, father of nine children. Died of a heart attack. Spoke Norse.
15. **Lu (390 – 428)** : Born and died in Tscheng-Tu (Kingdom of Wei, Western China). Silk worker. Married, with three children. Died in an accident. Spoke the local Wei dialect.
16. **Nittaho (298 – 322)** : Born on Vancouver Island (West Coast of Canada). Nootka hunter and fisherman. Married, had two children. Drowned during a fishing expedition. Spoke the Nootka language.
17. **Zembela (204 – 231)** : Born in Southeast Africa (Mozambique). Member of the Matabele tribe. Married to the son of the local chieftain at the age of thirteen. Died in labor after giving birth to a total of six children. Spoke the Matabele.
18. **Tanath (122 – 139)** : Nomadic Sarmatian boy, born east of the Black Sea. Member of the Alani tribe. Killed by cattle thieves while defending his herd. Spoke Sarmatian.
19. **Brigid (45 – 61)** : Born in the South of the British Isles. Daughter of Queen Boudicca, of the tribe of the Iceni. Was raped by Roman soldiers while her mother was being flogged. Followed her mother in a battle she lost against Roman soldiers, then took poison with her sister and mother in order not to fall alive into the hands of the Romans. Spoke Celtic.
20. **Luwasi (36 – 11 BCE)** : Masai herder and warrior born in Central Africa (Kenya). Married, with four children. Killed by cattle rustlers. Spoke a Masai dialect.
21. **Wou-Ti (140 -87 BCE)** : Emperor of the Chinese Han Dynasty. Repelled the Hun barbarians from the North. Under his reign, the Chinese Empire reached its maximum expansion in history. Spoke Mandarin, Cantonese and Tibetan.
22. **Caius Demetrius Faustinus (277 – 220 BCE)** : Born in Rome from a noble family. Doctor, surgeon and herbalist. A man with a great heart, tried to help the poor and the slaves. Died of pneumonia while serving as a surgeon with the Roman legions in Northern Italy. Spoke Latin, Greek and Koine.
23. **Mahamana (412 – 345 BCE)** : Born in Tahiti. Polynesian woman of great beauty. Dancer of the King of Tahiti, then became nurse for the King's family. Died of old age. Spoke Polynesian.
24. **Megaron (514 – 481 BCE)** : Born in Sparta, Greece. Hoplite killed at the famous Battle of the Thermopyles between the 300 Spartan warriors of King Leonidas and the Persians. Spoke Attic Greek.

25. **Tanethou (615 – 587 BCE)** : Born near Memphis, Egypt. Married to a peasant, mother of five children. Died in labor. Spoke Ancient Egyptian.
26. **Buluc (708 – 670 BCE)** : Born in a village near the Olmec city of La Venta (modern Spanish name). Peasant, father of three children. Killed by a robber. Spoke Olmec.
27. **Shourya (816 – 771 BCE)** : Born near Patalipoutra (India). Daughter of an Arian warrior and of a local Dravidian woman. Followed her father and the Arian armies along their conquest of the South of India. Given to an Arian officer as a wife. Had five children. Died of a disease. Spoke Dravidian and Sanskrit.
28. **Tarumadam (919 – 881 BCE)** : Born on the island of Java (Indonesia). Fruit merchant. Married, with four children. Died during a flood caused by a tsunami. Spoke Javanese.
29. **Chinoa (1006 – 985 BCE)** : Born in Chiripa, near Lake Titicaca (Peru). Daughter of a Wankarani farmer. Married, died in labor. Spoke the Wankarani dialect.
30. **Althéa (1107 – 1072 BCE)** : Born near Chalkis, Island of Eube (Greece). Ionian woman, minor priestess of Athena. Celibate. Died of a disease. Spoke Ionian Greek.
31. **Queikou (1226 – 1180 BCE)** : Born on the Mongolia steppes. Hiong Nou nomadic warrior. Participated in the attacks against the China of the Chan Dynasty. Owned two Chinese concubines. Father of seven children. Killed during a raid against a Chinese city. Spoke Hiong Nou and the Chinese Yen dialect.
32. **Um-Ulasch (1348 – 1295 BCE)** : Born in Susa, Elam (Mesopotamia). Merchant, married, father of three children. Mostly traded with the Chaldean caravans from Ur, Larsa and Uruk. Died of cancer. Spoke Elamite, Chaldean, Kassite and Aramaic.
33. **Themis (1462 – 1413 BCE)** : Born in Amara, Egypt. Wife of a scribe. Well educated, helped her husband in his work. Mother of five children. Died of a disease. Spoke Ancient Egyptian and Numidic.
34. **Mictou (1570 – 1531)** : Born on the plains of Central Canada (present Manitoba). Nomadic hunter-gatherer, followed his tribe around the plains. Married, with three children. Killed by a bison rendered mad by a lance jab from Mictou. Spoke an old Blackfoot dialect.
35. **Agar (1682 – 1641 BCE)** : Born in Egypt from a slave couple. Sold as a slave to the patriarch Abraham. Had a son from him (Ishmael). Kicked out with her son into the desert by a jealous Saraï (inhabited by the soul of Nancy Laplante at the time). Died of old age. Spoke Old Egyptian and Old Sumerian.
36. **Mabete (1802 - 1771 BCE)** : Born on the shores of the Congo River. Nomadic hunter-gatherer. Married, father of four children. Killed by a buffalo he was hunting. Spoke a now forgotten Congolese dialect.

37. **Maeve (1906 – 1881 BCE)** : Born on the site of modern Cork, in Ireland. Daughter of a Celt fisherman. Married at the age of fourteen, had six children. Died during her seventh childbirth. Spoke an old form of Gaelic.

38. **Tambali (2038 – 1993 BCE)** : Born on the island of Java. Canoe builder and stone tool maker. Married, with five children. Small but robust man. Died crushed by a falling tree. Spoke Javanese and Balinese.

39. **Sorkhan (2135 – 2104 BCE)** : Born north of the Caspian Sea. Indo-European hunter and warrior from the Saka tribe. Married, father of three children. Killed in a fight with another Indo-European tribe. Spoke a dialect of the Indo-European Satem language.

40. **Inaram (2260 – 2221 BCE)** : Born in the city of Meggido(Canaan). Wife of a pottery maker, mother of seven children. Died of a disease. Spoke Cananean.
